# CAREER TIMELINE

## NSF Early Career Development Program

This program, offered by the Broader Impacts Network (BIN), provides proposal development assistance to UM System faculty interested in submitting a Faculty Early Career Development Program (CAREER) proposal and is offered at no cost.

The NSF CAREER program supports junior faculty who exemplify the role of teacher-scholars through outstanding research, excellent education, and the integration of education and research within the context of the mission of their organizations. NSF encourages submission of CAREER proposals from junior faculty members and especially encourages women, members of underrepresented minority groups, and persons with disabilities to apply.

Workshops led by BIN staff will begin in October. Participants should be prepared to meet several times over the course of the year, and complete proposals should be ready for review by May. NSF has not yet posted final submission dates, but participants should anticipate mid-to-late July submission to NSF.
